Annual School Reports

As you are aware this year the school curriculum and assessment has changed, with the removal of levels and sub levels. We are currently in the process of writing end of year school reports which reflect the changes. The new report format includes an attainment and effort grade for each area of the curriculum. Pupils will be assessed against



nationally expected standards for their age and this will be reported as A =working above the standard expected for their age, E =working at the standard expected for their age and T =working towards the standard expected for their age.

For the first time we are reporting on the effort pupils demonstrate towards their learning. This reflects the hard work and commitment they have shown, in coping with the demands of the new curriculum. The pupils will be awarded A = demonstrating an excellent attitude towards learning, B = a good effort demonstrated towards learning and C = an improvement is required. We are planning to send the annual

School Visits & Activities


Foundation Classes

lots of enthusiasm and excitement for learning.




The Gruffalo Big Write

The children are preparing to take part in the Big Write this term, using the Gruffalo as a stimulus. This is something the whole

school take part in regularly, where the children are encouraged to write for a sustained amount of time. There will be lots of opportunities for the children to talk about their writing and teachers will be modelling what is expected.

Key Stage 1



It is interesting to see the children in Key Stage 1 carefully observing their tadpoles and describing how they are changing. Some are already reaching stage 3 with little legs appearing. I am sure that they are keeping you informed about their progress.
