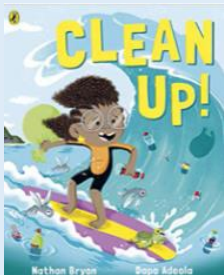

Top Tips

- Regular reading times.
- Variety of reading ranging from pictures books, chapter books, magazines, comics, web research and audio books.
 - Lead by example—let them see you reading!
- Reading talk— talk to them about what they enjoy reading. This can help with future book choices.
 - Create a reading challenge at home— a way to motivate.
 - Set aside time without distractions turning off TV and computers.
 - Make it fun—it doesn't matter how you read as long as you enjoy the time together.
