## Head Lice Alert

Unfortunately some classes in the school appear to be plagued by head lice this term, which has become irritating and expensive for some families to repeatedly have to treat. It is recommended that an effective way of everyone treating head lice is to use a nit comb. Cover the infected hair in conditioner (so the lice will lose their grip) and comb through, starting at the root and going all the way to the tips. After each stroke, check the comb for lice and clean it on a tissue to see if there are some on it. You need to comb the hair for at least 30 minutes and repeat four more times over the following two weeks to ensure all the head lice are removed, and to capture any head lice that may hatch between combing sessions. Hopefully if everyone in the class affected is treated then

we can attempt to eradicate the problem.

Letters and Reply Slips In an attempt to encourage the children's independence and confidence we are requesting that if possible reply slips and

letters sent into school are given to class teachers by the children. If parents wish to hand letters in themselves could they try to use the blue post box situated at the front entrance of the school. This will be emptied each morning at 9 am.
